#### **Entity Information**

Who are we and why do we exist?

The **entity** is an Incorporated Society (Society Number 1662922) and Registered Charity (Reg. No. CC22804) with a **mission** "To increase the ecological health of Centennial Park for its long-term enjoyment".

### It's **objectives** are to:

- provide guardianship and protect the long term interests of the park
- educate the public and harness community interest
- advocate for flooding management and water quality
- work with council to achieve weed control, planting and plant management
- advocate for track maintenance and development.

The society is **run** by a committee of volunteers elected annually at a public meeting.

The association's **source of cash and resources** is from grants and voluntary donations. There are no employed staff, all work being carried out by volunteers or contractors.

Centennial Park Bush Society worked for the following outcomes:

- 1. Progressive improvement of the park's bush environment
- 2. Weeds under control throughout the park with a progressive reduction in major weed presence (trees & plants)
- 3. Bird life enhanced by reducing pests through trapping and other appropriate measures
- 4. Tracks maintained through volunteer effort and appropriate contracts in co-operation with Auckland Council staff
- 5. Progressive improvement of educational and helpful signage
- 6. Developing the "Campbells Bay Urban Sanctuary (CBUS) Project" to educate the community and achieve "Buy-in" to environmental improvement in Campbells Bay.
