Entity Information

Who are we and why do we exist?

The **entity** is an Incorporated Society (Number 1662922) and Registered Charity (CC22804) with a **mission** "To increase the ecological health of Centennial Park for its long-term enjoyment".

Its objectives are to:

- provide guardianship and protect the long term interests of the park
- · educate the public and harness community interest
- · advocate for flooding management and water quality
- · work with council to achieve weed control, planting and plant management
- advocate for track maintenance and development.

The society is **run** by a committee of volunteers elected annually at a public meeting along with some seconded members between annual meetings.

The association's **source of cash and resources** is from grants and voluntary donations. There are no employed staff, all work being carried out by volunteers or contractors.

Statement of Service Performance (Description of the Entity's Outcomes & Outputs)

"What did we do in the year ended 31 March 2022"

Centennial Park Bush Society worked for the following outcomes:

- 1. Progressive improvement of the park's bush environment
- 2. Weeds under control throughout the park with a progressive reduction in major weed presence (trees & plants)
- 3. Bird life enhanced by reducing pests through trapping and other appropriate measures
- 4. Tracks maintained through volunteer effort and appropriate contracts in co-operation with Auckland Council staff
- 5. Increased ecological awareness and knowledge through planning for an annual family camp in the coming year
- 6. Progressive improvement of educational and helpful signage
- 7. Ongoing development of the "Campbells Bay Urban Sanctuary (CBUS) Project" to educate the community and achieve "Buy-in" to environmental improvement in Campbells Bay. As part of this we became a member organisation of the recently formed "Restore Hibiscus & Bays".
- 8. Improved stream water quality through education of owners of properties adjacent to Campbells Bay stream in association with "Save our Streams".

Note 1: There are two aspects of focus in the park: Restoration of the native bush and development of the Arboretum. Predator control is intended to benefit both native bush restoration and birdlife enhancement.

Note 2: As part of the Campbells Bay Urban Sanctuary (CBUS) project volunteers continued to work on Campbells Bay School bush, Greville Reserve, the Dairy Garden, Huntly Road corner and Campbells Bay Reserve. The splits between time in the park and hours outside the park are estimates.

Note 3: As an additional component of CBUS the society sponsored the "Save Our Streams" project.

Note 4: In addition to the installations described, 22 possum traps and 21 rat traps are available to residents on loan.
